Three Ballot Questions Threaten our Communities.

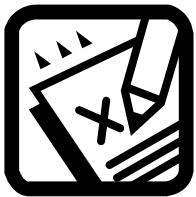
Take a Stand! Vote No, No, No on

Ballot Question 1 Ends the Alcohol Tax

Vote No on Question 1 – Protect our Services

- The alcohol tax is the only source of state money for drug and alcohol abuse treatment.
- Massachusetts has one of the highest rates of drug and alcohol abuse in the country – we can't afford to cut treatment services.

Ballot Question 2 Ends the Affordable Housing Law

Vote No on Question 2 – Protect Affordable Housing

- *The Affordable Housing Law* is the most effective tool Massachusetts has to create affordable housing.
- Over the last ten years, *The Affordable Housing Law* created 80% of the affordable housing outside the major cities in Massachusetts.
- Approximately 58,000 affordable homes have been created for seniors and families. Approximately 40,000 are apartments and 18,000 are homeownership.
- Nearly 100 communities have made affordable housing plans because of *The Affordable Housing Law*.

Ballot Question 3 Reduces the Sales Tax

Vote No on Question 3 – Protect our Communities

- Would mean even more severe cuts to schools, parks, roads, youth programs, healthcare and services for seniors.
- Would take away more than \$2.5 Billion from our State budget.
